## Organisations

**Antlers** is a nomadic commercial gallery curating temporary exhibitions of emerging artists, exploring themes such as narrative, space and the natural world.

**The Architecture Centre** is Bristol's centre for architecture and design: inspiring, informing and involving people through exhibitions, events, learning and outreach.

**Arnolfini** presents innovative work in the visual arts, performance, dance, film and music, accompanied by a programme of family events in a dedicated learning space.

**Bristol Museum & Art Gallery** is home to outstanding and diverse collections of art, archaeology, Egyptology, geology and natural history, plus on ongoing programme of fascinating temporary exhibitions and events.

**Centrespace Gallery** is an independent exhibition space for hire close to Bristol City centre. Painting, sculpture, printmaking, photography, installation, performance and film.

**The Control Room** formerly housed the controls for operating Redcliffe swing bridge, today is a distinct and exciting space opened up by Bristol City Council for artists to use for temporary public exhibitions.

**The Edwardian Cloakroom** is an architectural gem tucked away in Clifton, a space that Bristol City Council has opened up for artists to use for temporary public exhibitions.

**Fig** is a shop space run by a collective of six artists and makers showcasing and selling a range of works, including print, jewellery, gloss and textiles.

**The Grant Bradley Gallery** showcases a range of exciting exhibitions each month in the heart of South Bristol.

**Home** is a project based at the BV studios gallery space, hosting exhibitions by international emerging artists, peer group discussions and live events surrounding ideas on art and digital culture.

**The Island** is a multi use arts facility and creation centre in the old Police Station in Bristol city centre. It hosts a wide variety of creative spaces, from making spaces and artists studios to dark rooms, recording studios, a gallery and sound production studios.

**Jamaica Street Artists** has been established for over 20 years and the studio is housed in a grade II listed former carriage-works. JSA is a unique and ambitious collective, with members exhibiting, collaborating and working both nationally and worldwide.

**National Trust Tyntesfield** is part of Trust New Art Bristol – a programme of international, national and regional contemporary art projects, exhibitions and collaborations in and around National Trust properties in the Bristol area.

**The Royal West of England Academy** is England's only regional Royal Academy of Art. Its spectacular galleries host exhibitions celebrating the best of historic and contemporary art.

**Situations** is an internationally renowned public art producer. Situations opens up the potential for artists to make extraordinary ideas happen in unusual and unexpected places.

**Spike Island** is an international centre for the development of contemporary art and design and a vibrant hub for production, presentation and debate.

**Spike Print Studio** is the largest open-access print studio in the South West and a co-founding, not-for-profit studio group of Spike Island. The studio supports all levels of experience and has a great atmosphere where people of all ages come together because of their love of print.

**View Art Gallery** is one of the largest independent galleries in the South West, and brings a fresh and vibrant feel to showing contemporary art.
